## The Weather from John Harrison

"High Summer" (that's July and August) 2025 brought a continuation of the spells of hot weather across Western Europe as a result of further atmospheric 'blocking' although the pressure was never exceptionally high. During July the airflow changed towards easterly by the 9th and by the 11th the temperature had reached 29.5 °C. The weather was oppressively heavy at times and widespread thunderstorms reached Northumberland by the 21st. During this 'heatwave' between the 8th and 23rd the average daytime maximum temperature was 23.1 °C. For the remainder of July the airflow moved around to a cooler and damper westerly direction. Into August, relief from the heat was brief as pressure remained low for a few days and there was fresh westerly breeze in which Storm Floris brought blustery showers on 4th, which left a carpet of windfalls. As the pressure began to rise steadily after the 9th the UK came under the influence of a broad area of very hot tropical air which resulted in many daytime temperature records being broken.

On the 13th the temperature in Haydon Bridge generally exceeded 31 °C. The heat lingered for several days up to the 17th before returning on the 23rd for a final week of warmth accompanied by a fresher breeze and intermittent light rain as complex cyclonic weather patterns dominated the weather chart. Nationally, the summer has been one of records, high temperatures and low rainfall. The weather has affected the farming and gardening year and as I write, most of the local streams are running low or are completely dry. The question, which I don't have the space here to address, is whether hot and dry summers are to be expected as climates change.

## **Local Archive**

#### A Nice Day Out

Haydon Bridge has long been a tourist destination. In the later  $19^{th}$  and early  $20^{th}$  centuries one of the main attractions was the Haydon Spa also known as the Spa Well - a natural sulphur spring about a mile east of the village on the south side of the river. In 1863 the Haydon Bridge Picnic Committee put up a small basin to collect water from the Well and a stone lintel was put up inscribed with the date -8 June 1863.



By the 1890s however the site was almost inaccessible after a landslip. In 1897 as part of the village's celebrations of Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee the Parish Council decided to restore and improve the Spa Well as a permanent memorial to honour the Queen's reign. In 1898 a footpath was laid and railed off from the main road to the Well and a substantial stone structure built, with a cemented square and a metal paling. The original 1863 plaque was relocated here and a new granite plaque added. There are many postcards in the Bridge digital archive showing the renovated Spa Well. Today the Spa Well is again largely inaccessible due to flooding and erosion. This brief overview of the Spa Well is based on Dennis Telford's Historical Notes of Haydon Bridge originally published in the Haydon News. There is article about this in the edition of July 2001. #### The Bee Friendly Walk

Dixon has made and installed the most beautiful plant troughs on the road bridge to start the creation of our Bee Friendly Walk, which will take in the bridges and John Martin Street. Thank you Dixon!

Look out for bench seats and planters coming soon on the old bridge and bus stop coming into the village from the east.



Brian Howard has been elected as Vice Chair. Some recent activities:

- As part of work to make it safer for road users and residents, road markings have been improved in the Showfield, John Martin Street and Ratcliffe road, including the doming of the roundabout, with better signage in Temple Houses and to the Football Club.
- A number of drains have been unblocked on Ratcliffe road and Church Street.
- The bus shelter at the east end of the village has been repaired and repainted. We have written to Stagecoach and Joe Morris MP to ask for the bus service to be improved.

 The riverside picnic area has been smartened up, the vandalised BBQ has been repaired, and the bin area has been paved

#### Ongoing works:

- The PC are looking at installing a bus shelter opposite Innerhaugh Mews and the bus shelter is being repaired at Langley.
- Waste bins have been replaced on Shaftoe Green. 1 of the bins on Shaftoe Green is going to replaced, as well as the bin next to the gate into the estate B6319
- Trees in the church yard and blocking the street lights in the Showfields will be pruned
