## The Weather from John Harrison

In May atmospheric pressure remained relatively high at the start of the month but soon began to fall away as complex cyclonic systems brought in cool and damp air from Atlantic. Moderate rainfall occurred on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, the wettest day of the month and as the wind moved to a more northerly direction air temperatures remained at or just below average. As low pressure dominated the weather between the 9<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> a freshening northerly breeze, was accompanied by chilly and damp conditions. As pressure began to rise slowly the UK experienced a broad anticyclonic ridge which dominated the weather over the final two weeks. The change in weather that occurred was remarkable as hot air was drawn in from southern Europe and Africa. The National News was dominated by references to record-breaking high temperatures, particularly in the southern half of the UK. The daytime maximum of 16 degC. on the 20<sup>th</sup>, for example, contrasted with 27 degC. on the 25<sup>th</sup>. There was, however, a marked shortage of rainfall.

As pressure began to decrease at the start of June, the wind direction shifted towards westerly, and temperatures decreased towards values more typical of spring. By the 4<sup>th</sup> the daytime maximum was only 14.3 degC. There was also intermittent rainfall over the first twelve days which compensated for the shortage experienced during April and May. An intense high pressure began to develop to the south and east of Britain by mid-month which drew in exceptionally hot air from continental western Europe, a second visitation of what we experienced at the end of May. Temperatures in excess of 30 degC occurred daily over Western Europe with isolated values in excess of 40 degC. Here in Northumberland temperatures were little more than uncomfortably warm with the promise of cooler and damper conditions by the end of the month.

### Haydon Hundred Cyclo Sportif – SAVE THE DATE FOR 2027: Saturday 12 June

The Haydon Hundred 2026 on Saturday 13 June offered a choice of 60k, 100k and 140k routes. Entries this year were up to 151. 126 started and 121 finished. Most importantly we raised over 2,700 towards the running costs of The Bridge Library and Community Hub and we had really positive feedback – see example below.

### Local Archive – A short history of motor garages in Haydon

**Bridge** Scudamore's Garage is a long-established family business in Haydon Bridge, founded by Henry Scudamore as a horse-drawn taxi service on John Martin Street. According to the 1911 census Henry's father, Alfred, worked as a Livery stables keeper on John Martin Street and Henry was a groom. By 1914 the Kelly's Directory for Haydon Bridge listed Alfred Scudamore as a 'Jobmaster' - a person who supplied carriages and horses and drivers for hire. With the growth of motorised transport, motor garages began to open in the village. In 1921 the census now lists Alfred Scudamore as a garage proprietor and Henry as a motor driver. In the same year Henry Watson opened his garage on Shaftoe Street. Charles McKay appears as a garage in the 1929 directory, having been first listed as a carman back in 1921. Later known as Hattersley's and then owned by John Clarke (the newsagent)



the garage was by what is now Larkin Terrace. In the 1934 directory Allen Scudamore is listed as a motor car garage (but still also a Jobmaster), at the Anchor Garage. By 1938 there were four garages in the village with Bernard Mason Fitzgerald, Motor Engineer, also working from Eastern garage, where Whittis Row is now. In the 21<sup>st</sup> century only two remained, Watson's and Scudamore's. In 2012 Scudamore's moved from their original site to Station Yard. Watson's Garage, also a family run business, eventually closed after nearly 100 years. Scudamore's however continues to flourish well over a century since the business began.

### ALERT: Reducing the energy costs in your home

Around 30 households talked to the team from CAN, including a number of in-depth advice discussions. Anna Revell, one of CAN's Climate Action Officers, says *"It was fantastic to meet so many people from the local community at such an amazing family event, celebrating the Nurture Community Garden project. We're looking forward to supporting your community with practical energy advice and helping everyone make informed choices about saving energy and reducing costs."*

### Haydon Bridge High School

**Art Workshop with Allendale Primary School:** On Friday 19th June, our Art teacher Faye Laydon visited Allendale Primary to run a workshop with Year 4,5 and 6 pupils. Pupils explored 'Sycamore gap, before and after' and other aspects of Northumberland wildlife. New techniques of pastels and polyblock printing were used to produce individual postcards which pupils were then able to take home. Miss Leydon was delighted with the efforts and impressed with the quality of artwork.

### Charity Day at HBHS - Teenage Cancer Trust Fundraiser:

In March our incredible Year 12 embarked on their annual job to organise the HBHS Charity Day in aid of the Teenage Cancer Trust. This year's theme was "music and musicals" with staff and students encouraged to dress up as their favourite musician or musical influence. The day also coincided with our Year 11 leaving so the atmosphere was one of joy and excitement. The year groups took turns to spend time having fun in the sports hall on the giant inflatable, playing the games and trying to win some great prizes. Alongside all this great fun, the Year 12s also had a tuck shop so the students could get themselves some treats to keep their energy up as they raced their mates on the inflatable. At lunch time the students thoroughly enjoyed the annual "soak the teacher" event, with members of staff willingly sitting there whilst students paid to throw sponges and buckets of ice-cold water at them. You may well have heard their shrieks!





In total Charity Day raised a further £1200. This meant that the grand total came to a whopping £2295.32. An incredible total which was way more than the target of £1500 that Year 12 had set themselves. This beat that amount raised by the current Year 13 when they were in charge!!! This was Year 12's goal! We are very proud of all pupils, and especially Y12 for organising the event.

### Rooted in Nature @Nurture Community Garden

At our fabulous community event on 7 June, we foraged for herbs and brewed medicinal teas, wove wonderful willow creations, made lovely nature art, got advice about energy in the home, and learnt what The Bridge Hub offers.

It was a chance to celebrate the completion (nearly!) of our Bridging People through Nature project, funded by The Royal Countryside Fund. This saw the creation of The Bridge Plant and Produce stall as somewhere to both grow plants for and give surplus harvests to, raising money through donations to support running The Bridge Library & Community Hub, including our Community Library. The new planters and seating on the Bee Friendly Walk around the village centre were installed and are looked after by volunteers including the village public space gardeners and Shaftoe Primary School, with a special BIG shout out to Dixon for making and growing flowers for those on the road bridge. They all look lovely and the benches are well used.

Our new Easy Garden Group meets on Thursdays 3-4.30, using the large potting and picnic table to work, chat, nibble and have a cuppa at, sowing seeds for more plants for both the stall, village planters and the Community Garden. Our amazing Community Garden volunteers ran a food stall. And brilliant local businesses offered generous raffle prizes. Thank you all. Money raised will build a deck in the pond area. Thank you to everyone who came and to the The Royal Countryside Fund for their support.

Our Super Saturday Public Garden sessions 10-1 will continue over the summer. Our Wonderful Wednesdays and Easy Garden Group on Thursdays, both 3-4.30 are term time only, so last ones are July 15/16, restarting September 9/10. These are now funded by The National Lottery Awards for All Environment Fund, and Thriving Together Fund

### Parish Council Update

Things we have been doing to improve the Parish in May and June:

- Completed road improvements:
  - Drains have been cleared and refurbished on Tofts Bank between North Bank and Heugh House Lane
  - Potholes have been filled near Cruel Syke, and along the Silver Lonnen from New Alston to Newbrough. The road near Standalone has also been patched.
  - The white lines have been refreshed from Innerhaugh to Hordley Acres
  - Drains on Ratcliffe Road have been cleared
- Works planned in the next month:
  - Yellow lines on John Martin Street will be extended and a passing place created on Ratcliffe Road.
  - Drains on Ratcliffe road will be cleared

- A camera survey of drains on the North Bank near Haydon View have revealed a blockage which will be dealt with.
- Trees are to be removed below Woodhall Mill, this will require the closure of the road of the A69.
- Other improvements:
  - Efforts have been made to dissuade campervans from parking overnight at the picnic site
  - Bins are being placed at the bus shelters to the east and west of the village.
- We have been contacting Stagecoach to try and demand a better bus service; a public meeting was held in Hexham Library last week to try and improve the situation.
